A trip to the market town of Enniskillen to visit Blake's Bar, one of the oldest pubs in Ireland, is also a guest favourite.

Other visits include a hosted stay or lunch at Ballywalter Park with Lord & Lady Dunleath, who have an amazing Victorian garden and cuisine to match and an outstanding cellar, or a visit to Grey Abbey where you can dine with Bill and Daphne Montgomery and hear about their illustrious connections to the White House, the American War of Independence, and who lent their family name to the naming of the capital of Alabama.

The Hon. Christopher Brooke, owner of Ashbrooke, and his brother Alan, Lord Brookeborough of Colebrooke and Knight of Garter to the Queen, belong to a family with a very strong military history and are also enthralling hosts for our clients.

#### **Country Pursuits**

If you're game, you can indulge in a little hunting and fishing at Baronscourt Estate with Lord Jamie Hamilton, son of the Duke and Duchess of Abercorn. As well as having one of the largest herds of pure Sika deer in Ireland, there is fantastic salmon fishing on the River Mourne and pike fishing on the Estate's lakes. Colebrooke Park, seat of Lord Brookeborough, is also a fine shooting estate.

#### The Cities of Belfast & Derry-Londonderry

A fascinating way to explore Northern Ireland's recent troubled history, is through a private Black Taxi Tour of Belfast which takes in the Peace Wall and political murals. The city is also home to some architectural delights such as Stormont Buildings and City Hall, a rich maritime heritage, award winning visitor attractions such as Titanic Belfast and the interactive science centre W5, plus a variety of warm and inviting watering holes like the Crown Liquor Saloon, famous for its perfectly preserved 18th Century décor.

Unsurprisingly, as one of Ireland's oldest cities, there's lots of history to absorb in Derry-Londonderry including the Siege, the Battle of the Bogside and Bloody Sunday. Make sure to explore the magnificent 17th Century city walls, Bogside murals and Tower Museum.

But the attractions aren't all historical, Derry-Londonderry is also well known for the burgeoning live music scene, which you can enjoy in a number of the city's lively pubs.

### **Golf's Paradise**

Despite its relatively small size, Northern Ireland is home to a surprising number of great golf courses, including some of the world's best links like Royal Portrush which hosted the British Open in 2019, and Royal County Down. Other notable courses include Ireland's oldest golf club Royal Belfast, Castlerock, Portstewart, Galgorm and Holywood, where 4-time major winner Rory McIlroy learned to play.



#### Wellness & Soft Adventure

With so many parks and estates, amazing, rugged coastlines and waterways, there is plenty of places to ramble and pursuits to enjoy.

Activities like horse-riding, water sports, yoga, biking and hiking are widespread and you can even unwind and centre your chi with a little forest-bathing and lakedipping at Finn Lough. Or if a little pampering is more your style, why not try the thermal spa village at Galgorm Resort or the Spa at Culloden Estate which is cancer accredited.

# ArChaeology & Mythology & History

Between the archaeological sites and monuments, stone circles and maritime remains, there's evidence of human activity dating back over 9,000 years. If you're interested in learning about the region's rich and varied human history, our guides draw on expert knowledge to bring the past to life, from the first signs of man in the Palaeolithic era to the struggle for Irish Independence just over a century ago. Other places of historical interest include the Ulster American Folk Park, the Ulster Folk and Transport Museum and Dunluce Castle, which is literally crumbling into the sea.

The Ulster Museum and Dark Sky Observatory in Omagh are also wonderful places to lose yourself for a few hours.

#### Literary Heritage

Northern Ireland's contribution to world literature is astounding; ponder the Mourne Mountains which inspired CS Lewis to create Narnia, in Belfast stand where the distinct outline of Cave Hill moved satirist Jonathan Swift to create the sleeping giant in Gulliver's Travels, or at the Seamus Heaney Homeplace, an arts and literary centre, immerse yourself in the Nobel Prize winner's world through stories, photographs and the voice of the poet reading his own words.

Not forgetting the Brontë Homeland Interpretative Centre, the Samuel Beckett Festival in Fermanagh, and the Verbal Arts Centre and Writers Square in Belfast. A Taste of Ulster

#### Jewish Northern Ireland

Visitors are often amazed by Belfast's rich Jewish history, dating back to the 1860s and 1870s. Instrumental to the growth of the linen industry, a few went on to become notable citizens including Sir Otto Jaffe who was the city's first Jewish Lord Mayor over 100 years before the first Catholic one.

The city's Jewish population also excelled overseas, becoming President of Israel, Chief Rabbi and a Minister of Foreign Affairs as well as one of the founders of the Haagen Dazs ice cream brand. Their names included Jaffe, Loewenthal, Boas, Betzold and Portheim.

From John Adams and JFK to Barak Obama and Joe Biden, no fewer than 21 US Presidents have traced their ancestry back to Ireland. Indeed, even the original White House architect was an Irish immigrant, whose design was based on Ireland's current parliament building, Leinster House.

Among the many points of interest, our tour includes visits to Tipperary which has links to both Ronald Reagan and Barack Obama, the JFK homestead in New Ross Co. Wexford, as well as Donegal and Down which have strong Ulster Scots connections to early US presidents Polk, Grant and Jackson.

The reminiscent Titanic Belfast & Drawing Rooms in Titanic Hotel bring you back to a bygone era. Explore film sites of the extremely popular, comedy series 'Derry Girls' which takes a wry look at the Troubles through the eyes of funloving teenagers.



#### **DAY1**

Private transfer to Derry, home of the popular series Derry Girls, where once checked-in and freshened up, you'll meet your walking guide to explore the origins of one of the longest inhabited places in Ireland. Unsurprisingly, there's lots of history to absorb here, from its magnificent 17th Century city walls and the Siege of Derry, to the Battle of the Bogside and Bloody Sunday. Be sure to explore the Bogside murals, along with taking in the burgeoning live music scene in the city's lively pubs.

**Overnight:** Bishop's Gate Hotel or Beech Hill Country House.

#### DAY 2

Sample the very best of the local food and drink on a private gastronomic tour of Derry City, tasting over 25 different local specialities, from craft beers and charcuterie to local cheeses and patisserie. You'll also get to meet the passionate craftspeople behind these fabulous flavours, who will explain the history behind many of the traditional foods in this corner of Northern Ireland.

#### **PAY3**

In the morning travel to County Tyrone possibly visiting Seamus Heaney Homeplace.

First thing, we travel to County Tyrone for our astronomy meets archaeology experience, making our way to the Sperrins, an ancient mountain range which Irish people have been calling home for millennia. There with your specialist Davagh Forest guide, you will explore the area's rich archaeological heritage - ancient field systems, standing stones, stone circles, and burial tombs which offer a tantalising glimpse into the culture, creativity and religious beliefs of Ireland's original hunter-gatherers and the bronze age settlers who lived and worked in the Broughderg River Valley over 10,000 years ago.

In the evening, explore the night sky with a local astronomer, who fascinatingly links the local landscape and archaeology to the heavens above. The lack of light pollution at Davagh Forest means it's one of only 78 locations in the world with official international dark sky accreditation, making it one of the finest places on the planet to observe the stars. **Overnight:** Sperrinview Luxury

Glamping or Corick House Hotel.

#### DAY 4

Tour to County Fermanagh, an area of Northern Ireland known for the pristine waterways of Lough Erne and its beautiful rolling countryside. Begin by exploring Enniskillen, Ireland's only island town, whose landmark castle straddles upper and lower Lough Erne. Next take a private water taxi to explore the Lough's biodiverse ecosystem and one of the 150 islands dotted across it - Devinish Island. There you will explore the 6th Century monastery and ruins of notable churches, a fascinating slice of history which some quests have also found to be a spiritually moving experience. Finish with a specialist distillery tour, tasting locally produced farm-to-bottle organic spirits.

**Overnight:** Lough Erne Resort, Ashbrooke House or Crom Castle.

#### **DAY5**

Enjoy a private, hand-crafting experience at Ireland's oldest pottery – Belleek - learning the techniques used to create their magnificent pieces, before having a go yourself.
